2 Log Data

In addition, we may use third party services such as Google Analytics that collect, monitor and analyze this information.

3 Links to other websites

4 Cookies

- 4.1 Cookies are files with small amount of data, which may include an anonymous unique identifier. Cookies are sent to your browser from a web site and stored on your computer's hard drive. The web application can tailor its operations to your needs, likes and dislikes by gathering and remembering information about your preferences.
